Within the domain of continuing education, professional continuing education is a specific learning activity generally characterized by the issuance of a certificate or continuing education units (CEU) for the purpose of documenting attendance at a designated seminar or course of instruction. Licensing bodies in a number of fields (such as teaching and healthcare) impose continuing education requirements on members who hold licenses to continue practicing a particular profession. These requirements are intended to encourage professionals to expand their foundations of knowledge and stay up-to-date on new developments. Depending on the field, these requirements may be satisfied through college or university coursework, extension courses or conferences and seminars attendance. Although individual professions may have different standards, the most widely accepted

standard, developed by the International Association for Continuing Education & Training, is that ten contact hours equals one Continuing Education Unit. 111 Not all professionals use the CEU convention. For example, the American Psychological Association accredits sponsors of continuing education and uses simply a CE approach. In contrast to the CEU, the CE credit is typically one CE credit for each hour of contact.

What can a congregation expect from an interim pastor?

Like all pastors, Interim Pastors offer to the congregations they serve: Worship leadership and preaching, Pastoral care, Work with the session to provide for the life and ministry of the congregation, Administrative work including supervision of other staff persons, Staff support for programs and committees of the congregation.

In addition, an Interim Pastor leads a congregation during the transition time after an installed pastor has departed, helping the congregation prepare to welcome the leadership of a new installed pastor. Interim Pastors understand the dynamics of a congregation in transition, including feelings of grief, loss, and, sometimes, relief or anger.

Interim pastors will help the session provide for continuity of essential programs and may assist the session in assessing needs for changes in programs and ministries of the congregation.

Some interim pastors have special skills and experience that can help a congregation recover from a time of conflict or after the disclosure of clergy sexual misconduct or other trauma.

Ordinarily, an interim pastor is not eligible to serve as the next installed pastor, or co-pastor, or associate pastor of the congregation (G-2.0504c). The interim pastor may, if the session and the Committee on Ministry approve, work with the session in a mission study or assist the Pastor Nominating Committee in gathering data for the writing of the Church Information Form. With those possible exceptions, the interim pastor may not be involved in the work and discernment of the PNC.

A good interim pastor will "hit the ground running," beginning his/her time with the congregation with intensity and energy, and will leave with intentionality, engaging in a "good goodbye" with the congregation and its staff. A good interim pastor is fully present with the congregation from the beginning, and really leaves when she/he leaves.

Interim pastors serve a unique role. A church calls an interim pastor for a fixed period of time to deal with a defined set or problems. The interim pastor may be hired to provide pulpit supply while the search committee looks for the next pastor. An interim pastor could be retained to provide leadership during a period of major change such as a building program. Interim pastors may also be hired to deal with difficult problems the congregation can't handle such as a power struggle between important players, conflict resolution or resolving severe financial challenges.

Loneliness is a complex and usually unpleasant <u>emotional</u> response to <u>isolation</u>. Loneliness typically includes anxious feelings about a lack of <u>connection</u> or <u>communication</u> with other beings, both in the present and extending into the future. As such, loneliness can be felt even when surrounded by other people. The causes of loneliness are varied and include social, mental, emotional and physical factors.

Research has shown that loneliness is prevalent throughout society, including people in marriages, relationships, families, veterans, and those with successful careers. [1] It has been a long explored theme in the literature of human beings since classical antiquity. Loneliness has also been described as <u>social pain</u>—a psychological mechanism meant to motivate an individual to seek social connections. [2] Loneliness is often defined in terms of one's connectedness to others, or more specifically as "the unpleasant experience that occurs when a person's network of social relations is deficient in some important way". [3]



Thomas Wolfe who in an oft quoted passage stated "The whole conviction of my life now rests upon the belief that loneliness, far from being a rare and curious phenomenon, is the central and inevitable fact of human existence." [1]

13) Sabbath

A. SABBATH DAY (Recommended: 40 to 45 hours per week; at least one full day off)

1. Weekly Rhythm of Work and Rest Full-time called rostered leaders of our congregations must strive for a healthy balance in their lives between their time for God, time for their families and personal life, and their calling to the church. Clearly defined expectations of work and time off are important for both the rostered leader and the congregation. Knowing that some weeks will be more demanding and some less, 40 to 45 hours per week is a fair expectation for both congregation and rostered leader. A Sabbath day each week is God's command and, even more importantly, God's gift. Since church work requires a great deal of evening and weekend involvement, one way to reasonably set expectations with the rostered leader is to think in terms of blocks of time. Each day can be considered to have three blocks of time—morning, afternoon, and evening. A seven-day week consists of 21 time blocks. A reasonable expectation of full-time service might be 13-14 time blocks. Weekly time off to provide a normal opportunity for renewal, refreshment, and personal business would usually involve 7-8 time blocks per week. Arrangements should be flexible for both the rostered leader and the congregation, but should also provide for emergency pastoral care when the rostered leader is unavailable.

2. Encourage Rest as Well as Work Congregations should be sure to support their rostered leader taking at least one full day off each week. The specific regular day off each week should be announced and communicated so all understand this. Flexibility is necessary, but a definite pattern makes for better health and attitude for all concerned.

Sabbath-taking thoughts

- If you take a weekly Sabbath (day off) call it that have your secretary call it "Sabbath" put it on the calendar as the Pastor's Sabbath not only are you modeling Sabbath-taking, but parishioners are less likely to get a hold of you on your "Sabbath" than on your "day off" because it sounds holy (which it is).
- You and only you can be intentional about setting aside Sabbath time and then making it Sabbath time.
- There will always be exceptions and emergencies just make sure those are the exceptions and not the rule.
- If taking a whole day off is "impossible" then schedule Sabbath mornings or evenings in your week. When there are late night meetings come in later those days. When you have breakfast meetings - leave earlier those days.
- Plan out your week to get everything you MUST get done, done the other six days. Do not use your Sabbath as a buffer day to finish what you couldn't get done.
- Pull out your calendar RIGHT NOW look at your month ahead and SCHEDULE your Sabbath times as real appointments - you will be blessed and strengthened in your ministry!

But while research continues, a growing number of health care experts and religious leaders have settled on one simple remedy that has long been a touchy subject with many clerics: taking more time off.

The Pastor's Sabbath | Leadership Journal - Christianity Today

Daily and weekly rest

Sabbath means "quit." "Stop." "Take a break." The word itself has nothing devout or holy in it. It is a word about time, denoting our nonuse thereof, what we usually call "wasting time."

The biblical context is the Genesis week of creation. Sabbath is the seventh and final day, in which "[God] rested [shabath] ... from all His work which He had done" (Gen. 2:2 nasb). As we reenter that sequence of days when God spoke energy and matter into existence, we repeatedly come upon the refrain "And there was evening and there was morning, one day.... And there was evening and there was morning ..." (Gen. 1:5-31 nasb) — on and on, six times.

This is the Hebrew way of understanding day, but it is not ours. Our day begins with an alarm clock ripping the predawn darkness and closes, not with evening but several hours past that, when we turn off the electric lights. In our conventional references to day, we do not include the night except for the two or three hours we steal from either end to give us more time to work. Because our definition of day is so different, we have to make an imaginative effort to understand the Hebrew phrase *evening and morning, one day.* More than idiomatic speech is involved here; there is a sense of rhythm.



Commentary

1 Kings 19:4-8 Commentary by Sara Koenig – Working Preacher

Many interpreters of this text see Elijah as discouraged, suffering burnout from his ministerial (or prophetic) duties, or even exhibiting signs of depression. Richard Nelson explains, "God's therapy for prophetic burnout includes both the assignment of new tasks and the certain promise of a future that transcends the prophet's own success or lack of it."3 But Leong Seow observes, "Given his attitude, one should expect a divine rebuke. There is not one, however. Instead, there is a series of epiphanies...Elijah's perspective is strongly challenged, and a lesson is offered to him; but he is never rebuked for showing weakness."4

What Elijah receives are practical, tangible provisions that enable him to go "in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights" (verse 8). What is given, then, is sufficient and strengthening. The gospel lectionary for today identifies Jesus as the living bread that came down from heaven (John 6:51). Certainly, the bread of Jesus gives us strength for the iourneys in our lives, however difficult or overwhelming they may be.

Here's a scary statistic from Expastors.com: "50% of ministers starting out will not last 5 years. 1 out of every 10 ministers will actually retire as a minister in some form." I've been a pastor of one form or another for 40 years. Early in my life as a parish pastor I was feeling the pressure of being the pastor of a congregation whose senior pastor had just resigned due to alcoholism and other issues. A member of the council referred me to a local ecumenical Christian leader who welcomed me into a small support group made up of church and counseling professional called CARE. For over 30 years this small group has helped me and the others in it to work through our personal and professional issues, so we can restore and increase our personal and professional wellness. Come hear my story of how this small group has helped me continue on in ministry and explore how a similar small support group experience may help you to restore and increase our personal and professional wellness in the fact of all the pressures of ministry and life. If there's an interest, we will discuss setting up small support groups among those who attend. While this workshop is aimed primarily at church professionals, those in other professions and/or those interested in helping their church leaders maintain wellness are welcome, too.

Appreciative Interim Ministry Certificate Training Program

Interim Ministry or Transitional Ministry

Historically ministry during the time between senior pastors was called Interim Ministry. The current approach is to call this Transitional Ministry. This change in name also indicates a change in the scope of understanding transitions. Since any change, and not just the change in pastor, will result in change dynamics all clergy whether "settled pastors" or "interim" need to understand the process of facilitating change.

Our Transitional Ministry Training Programs would be very appropriate for:

Clergy ministering during a transition between senior pastors

Clergy joining new congregations as the settled pastor

Clergy on extended, but time limited ministries, as a response to special circumstances in the congregation

Settled clergy embarking on a significant change in congregational culture or ministry

Consultants and coaches to congregations in transition

Certificate in Appreciative Transitional Ministry

The Clergy Leadership Institute has developed a year-long Appreciative Transitional Ministry training program that is a unique blend of Theological Reflection, Appreciative Inquiry, Organizational Psychology, Transitional Leadership Theory.

The training which may be taken in a variety of locations is typically arranged in the following sequential format:

Transitional Ministry 1: Week Long Residential Intensive,

Introduction to Appreciative Inquiry (2.5 days)

Introduction to Appreciative Interim Ministry(2.5 days)

Weekly Teleconference for Implementation Consultation

Pre-Training Leadership Assessment

Transitional Ministry 2: Week Long Residential Intensive,

Appreciative Leadership for Transformation (5 days)

Transitional Ministry 1: Introduction to Appreciative Interim Ministry

This five-day intensive is broken into two segments. The first half is devoted to learning the philosophy and process of <u>Appreciative Inquiry</u> which provides the foundation of Appreciative Transitional Ministry. The second half of the training is devoted to presenting the incarnational model of Appreciative Transitional Ministry and strategies for joining a congregation and working with the parish dynamics to co-create preferred outcomes. Participants may complete these two segments separately at differing locations provided that the AI portion precedes the interim ministry training. Education - Interim Ministry Network

This three-day, self-contained Fundamentals of Transitional Ministry: The Work of the Leader course introduces theories that are foundational to interim ministry. The class hours are devoted to providing opportunities for experiential learning through the use of case studies and sacred story. The work of the interim leader is presented and discussed along with tools and resources that facilitate the work of the transitional leader.

While this course emphasizes the work of the transition pastor, it is helpful to judicatory and lay leaders to make informed and healthy choices about clergy leadership during times of transition.

Intentional Interim Ministry – Luther Seminary

The National Association of Lutheran Interim Pastors' basic education curriculum is designed for clergy and lay professionals to introduce participants to the practice of intentional interim ministry. Although focusing on Lutheran theology and polity, the event is open to all lay leaders and clergy desiring and/or called to this special ministry in congregations during a pastoral transition.

This course is designed in three phases (Planting, Cultivating and Harvesting) that cover a period of about six months. Phase I (Planting) is a residential week focusing on the theory, theology, leadership skills and congregational systems related to intentional interim ministry. We examine the interim journey through scenarios (propositional learning) including the dynamics of entry, pre-entry, stages and tasks of the congregation, emotional systems, conflict, grief, power structures, and leadership skills necessary to lead the congregation, and exiting/closure issues.

Phase II (Cultivating) is a six-month experience in a parish or institutional setting, ideally in a leadership transition, in which the participant in this program "puts into practice" the material learned in Phase I. During this time, you will learn contracting (covenanting), work on personal learning goals, and write two critical incident reports, all under the supervisor of your chosen fieldwork supervisor.

Phase III (Harvesting) is the second residential week at Mt. Olivet Retreat Center in Farmington, MN, May 4-8 2015 in which through a group process you will share one of your critical incident reports, review material learned in Phase I, and learn more about the dynamics of congregations in pastoral transition, and your leadership skills and needs. You will also discuss the biblical and theological connections in this special ministry as specifically related to the Lutheran church.

Note: Participants are responsible for securing a situation in which to complete Phase II fieldwork requirements. While most participants in the program will have a ministry site, some may not. NALIP program faculty will help you define options available for your fieldwork.

Finding opportunity in transition – the Center assists congregations in finding and maximizing the many positives that can accompany a change in pastors, as well as lessening the uncertainty of this period

Interim ministry offers significant opportunity to improve the health of a congregation and establish a basis for a long and meaningful relationship with the next pastor. In our experience, when congregations choose the form of interim ministry that best fits their situation, this can be a period of spiritual growth that also improves organizational effectiveness.

The center assists congregations in determining the type of interim ministry that will be most helpful for them, including: Traditional Interim Ministry - involves calling an interim pastor who provides limited services in worship leadership and pastoral care. A search committee works to locate a new pastor, and the Center helps congregations locate specialists who can lead that process. E-mail Les Robinson (congreg@wfubmc.edu) for more information.

Intentional Interim Ministry - a process that guides a congregation to explore its heritage, mission, leadership, and connection to the wider church before beginning the formal search for a new pastor. For detailed information on this aspect of our work, read Intentional Interim Ministry—In Perspective.

The center also trains interim pastors to serve as traditional interim pastors and intentional interim ministry specialists. To get started with this training, enroll in Interim Ministry for Today's Church. Training for intentional interim ministry requires that one enroll in this course first.

Rethinking Transitional Ministry by Norman Bendroth - Alban Institute

Many, if not most, interim ministers have received their training from the Interim Ministry Network, which continues to be the gold standard. The training is rigorous, requiring a three-day seminar in the Fundamentals of Transitional Ministry and a five-day intensive event called The Intentional Interim Minister. Those trained then work in "learning communities" of six to eight people coached by an IMN faculty member. Each member is to design a project based upon their training and the needs of the congregation they are serving. Before one can receive a certificate he or she must participate in five conference calls, field test the project, and reflect upon and receive feedback from their colleagues.

The Art of Transitional Ministry - Montreat Conference Center

The interim pastor is recognized as a specialized position in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Some interim pastors enter this field straight out of seminary, others enter at mid-career and find a new enthusiasm in this more specialized kind of ministry. Still others are retired ministers who wish to continue in service for a few more years. Presbyteries increasingly encourage sessions to call an interim while the congregation is in transition between installed pastors. Interim assignments vary in length from three months to a year or more.

This specialized ministry often requires skills which include reorganizing a session or congregation, problem-solving, program maintenance, and conflict management, as well providing trained leadership through a transitional period.

The interim is one who understands and helps the congregation address the five developmental tasks: coming to terms with history; shifts of leadership; thinking denominational linkages; discovering a new identity; and commitment to new pastoral leadership and to a new future.

The curriculum for these events has been standardized at regional sites across the country. Weeks are not repeatable. However, if it has been more than six years since you attended week I training you should take it again.

Training & Credentials - Intentional Interim Ministry

Training is a critical component to the success of the Intentional Interim Ministry program. Through the process, all intentional interim ministers participate in peer review and in continuing education and conferences to provide the best possible service to the congregations they serve.

A typical Intentional Interim Ministry pastor has 60 hours of formal training and a six-month period of supervised fieldwork. A Certificate of Study is received upon completion of the training.

Training programs are offered on the campus of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis and other sites, under the auspices of the National Association of Lutheran Interim Pastors (NALIP). Detailed information is available at www.nalip.net.

Intentional Interim Ministry training is a three-phase event led by two experienced trainers for up to twenty participants. Phase 1 begins with a four-day gathering to introduce concepts, tools, and techniques used in short-term, intentional, pastoral leadership. A thirty-day interval follows during which participants will obtain and review the General Board of Global Ministries "Church Profile" and "Neighborhood Profile" pertaining to their current appointments as well as complete a Birkman questionnaire.

The group reconvenes for Phase II which includes a Birkman de-brief, and training in the *Discipline* 213 assessment process. Additionally, participants are taught how to do CPR – how to write a "Change Process Report."

The participants return to their ministry settings for a six-month mentored practicum during which they will initiate the assessment process and program changes required by the *Discipline*. They will write about two of their experiences, at least, in CPR form. During Phase III, each participant presents two CPRs for group analysis and discussion.


