What ought to claim our attention now is "The Nones," those living in this post-Christian culture who claim no religious affiliation. Most of us were born when the culture agreed that church membership was part of the American way of life. That's less and less a given, particularly among younger generations, a trend we shouldn't view as a threat, but as an opportunity. Biblically and historically, the church is at its best as a missionary presence in a secular society, not as the dominant secular power. This is a good time to be the church.

Category D10: Merging or Consolidating Synods

1. Western Iowa Synod (5F) [2019]

WHEREAS, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) celebrated its thirtieth anniversary in 2018 and WHEREAS, the ELCA continues to function under the original structure of sixty-five synods in nine regions; and WHEREAS, the number of congregations, rostered leaders, and congregational members constituting the ELCA has declined significantly throughout those years: 5.2 million members in 1988 to 3.5 million today; 11,138 congregations in 1988 to 9,062 in 2018; 9,105 clergy with active calls to 6,868 between the years of 2005 to 2014; and WHEREAS, contributions to synods and to the churchwide organization continue to decline at a rate that is raising serious concerns and questions about the fiscal sustainability of these structures of the church; and

I served as a voting member to the American Lutheran Church convention in 1987 in Moorhead, Minnesota from the Northern Wisconsin District. This convention was a constituting convention for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). That convention was filled with anticipation and expectation. Now 30+ years later, the decline as spelled out above makes me wonder where the ELCA will be in 30+ years from now. How many churches will be ringing their bells to call people to services of worship? The following article poses a daunting question:

Will the ELCA Be Gone in 30 years? - Faith+Lead

According to projections from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's (ELCA) Office of Research and Evaluation, the whole denomination will have fewer than 67,000 members in 2050, with fewer than 16,000 in worship on an average Sunday by 2041. That's right: according to current trends, the church will basically cease to exist within the next generation.

The decline is projected to go from 5.2 million members in 1988 to fewer than 67,000 in 2050. The article gives three ways to name the root cause:

- 1) We live in a culture that makes it hard for people to imagine and be led by God.
- 2) We aren't clear about what's distinctive about being Christian
- 3) For these reasons, church isn't helping many people make meaning of their lives.

The article gives some steps to take:

- 1) Go back to basics.
- 2) Shift from performative to participatory spirituality.
- 3) Listen.
- 4) Translate.
- 5) Experiment.
- 6) Share.

3) Loss of clout

Emerson Powery, in commenting on the second reading for All Saints Sunday 2019 Ephesians 1:11-23, begins by stating,

In the western portion of the northern hemisphere, the church has lost much of its clout.

He goes on to give some reasons.

Some of this loss is due to a less religious age, in which people's needs (spiritual and otherwise) are met in other ways besides the local, ecclesial community. Declining attendance throughout the nation is one outcome of this situation. Equally significant is the presence and effect of scandals that plague the church community. From child abuse to support of unethical political leaders, the church has misplaced its loyalties unable to match its actions with its verbal commitment to follow the Jesus who resides on the side of the least of these.

He speaks of the challenges ahead.

One of the grand challenges of the contemporary church is not to regret its loss of status in the history of the Western world and attempt to reclaim it. Rather, this is an opportunity to return to (first-century) roots, when the Christian ecclesia held no influence. In fact, letters such as this one were sent to these small, surviving believing communities primarily to reassure fellow believers so that they would persevere in their faith. Even this letter written to a second (or, third) generation community notice the language of Ephesians 12-13—was intended to inspire believers to remain faithful as people of the "pledge." Not only are fewer people going, but those who attend are doing so less frequently. On the Sunday of the Baptism of Our Lord, I was happy to receive as many as came at the 2 congregations I was serving. It helped that the weather had warmed up after being bitterly cold the Sunday before. Also, there was a baptism at one of the churches. At the same time, there was an elementary school wrestling tournament at the elementary school in one town and a gun show at the high school in the other town. If there ever was a time that the social context was more deferential to congregations, that time has long past, and as evidenced by the previously mentioned events, that time is not coming back. Pastors are called to remain faithful to a Word and Sacrament ministry amid the competition for people's time and attention.

Occasionally, in the sermon, I will say something to the affect, "I want to thank you for being present in this service of worship as part of the gathered assembly. No doubt, there are many other activities that beckon for your attention. But you have chosen to worship God here today with the gathered assembly, and for that I thank you!"

7) Mow the grass

When I was growing up in Story City, Iowa in the 1960s, my dad wanted the grass to be mowed at the end of the week so that it looked presentable for Sunday. As the oldest son, it was my job to mow the grass. Sunday was meant for church in the morning, dinner at noon, and taking a nap or visiting the relatives in the afternoon. Now, I look around, and it seems as if Sunday is as good a day as any to mow the grass, especially if the lawn is big enough that it does not lend itself to being mowed on a weeknight. While the neighbors may cut their grass short and mow every 3 to 4 days, I set the mower as high as possible and mow 1X a week at the end of the week to make the lawn presentable for Sunday.

Normally weekly mowing is the rule, but some lawns need cutting more often. Other lawns will grow more slowly and might need cutting only once every ten days or two weeks. Generally, don't cut off more than one third of the grass blade.

The name *Colosseum* has long been believed to be derived from a <u>colossal statue of Nero</u> nearby^[4] (the statue of Nero was named after the <u>Colossus of Rhodes</u>). *Icitation needed* This statue was later remodeled by <u>Nero</u>'s successors into the likeness of <u>Helios</u> (*Sol*) or <u>Apollo</u>, the sun god, by adding the appropriate <u>solar crown</u>. ABTRACT – Previous research on sports fans has focused on entertainment value, collective group influence, and selfenhancement in explaining why and how they become sports fans. When I was growing up during "The numerical height of mainline Protestantism in the United States (which) occurred in the year 1965,"¹ our family did not own a television set. Others did, but we didn't.

Now 50+ years later, the average amount of television viewing is 5 hours a day. I do not want my home life to revolve around television. I occasionally watch VHSs and DVDs of my choosing as well as YouTube and Vimeo on the internet and sometimes go to public establishments to watch sporting contests, but otherwise eschew television consumption. I look at a computer screen enough for work and do not desire to look at a television screen for recreation.

Efforts today to rediscover the partnership in the early church of the assembly and the household as places of worship face an uphill battle. 18) Self-interest or Great Commandment?

The Congregation Council asked 3 members to serve on the transition task force. One of the members attended a service of worship once. Otherwise, I had not met the other 2 members at a service of worship. I suggested scheduling the meeting after a service of worship thinking that they could attend the service of worship and then stay for the meeting. It worked for one member. So, by the second meeting of this task force 3 months into my interim assignment, 2 of the members had each attended a service twice for a combined total of 4 times. One member had yet to attend a service of worship. The members talked excitedly about how they had reworked a previous Ministry Site Profile of 3 years earlier and how much it would cost to get a pastor. Well into the meeting, I drew their attention to the Mission question in the profile and their answer given.

Mission In light of the way you have described your ministry context in the Ministry Site Profile, what are the top three mission priorities which, if accomplished, hold the most promise for the continued development of this ministry?

Nurture sense of belonging Encourage greater participation in worship Enhance the involvement of our youth within the church

I asked them how they imagined they could "encourage greater participation in worship." One of them nervously replied, "More people come when the children sing." She went on to say that she attended services of worship regularly when her children attended Sunday School and Confirmation, but that she had not been attending regularly since.

The member, who had as yet to attend a service of worship said, "We came 5 out of 6 times when <u>(a former interim pastor at the congregation who was a retired long-term pastor at a neighboring congregation</u>) preached." Others chimed in to say that members at the neighboring congregation, from which the long-term pastor had retired, attended services of worship at area congregations when the retired pastor supply preached there.

I then asked, "So, are you going to say to the candidate, 'We'll come if we find you interesting but won't come if we don't find you interesting.'?" I also asked, "What if a new pastor cannot measure up to (the former interim pastor)?

I went on to say that, in the midst of the clergy shortage, candidates are looking for settings where the members are outwardly focused rather than inwardly focused and will shy away from settings where the members are looking for a pied piper. Instead of attending services of worship because of love of God and love of others,

For Epicurus, the purpose of philosophy was to help people attain a happy, tranquil life characterized by *ataraxia* (peace and freedom from fear) and *aponia* (the absence of pain). He advocated that people were best able to pursue philosophy by living a self-sufficient life surrounded by friends. He taught that the root of all human neurosis is death denial and the tendency for human beings to assume that death will be horrific and painful, which he claimed causes unnecessary anxiety, selfish self-protective behaviors, and hypocrisy. According to Epicurus, death is the end of both the body and the soul and therefore should not be feared. Epicurus taught that although the gods exist, they have no involvement in human affairs. He taught that people should behave ethically not because the gods punish or reward people for their actions, but because amoral behavior will burden them with guilt and prevent them from attaining *ataraxia*.

Like Aristotle, Epicurus was an empiricist, meaning he believed that the senses are the only reliable source of knowledge about the world. He derived much of his physics and cosmology from the earlier philosopher Democritus (c. 460–c. 370 BC). Like Democritus, Epicurus taught that the universe is infinite and eternal and that all matter is made up of extremely tiny, invisible particles known as *atoms*. All occurrences in the natural world are ultimately the result of atoms moving and interacting in empty space. Epicurus deviated from Democritus in his teaching of atomic "swerve", which holds that atoms may deviate from their expected course, thus permitting humans to possess free will in an otherwise deterministic universe.

propose the term <u>Sheilaism</u> to describe religious belief for many as highly individualized. They identify a character they call Sheila Larson who tries to make sense of her life by mixing together various tenets and ideas and by listening to the voice in her head. This characterization has since become a sociological term called Sheilaism.

Sheilaism is a shorthand term for an individual's system of religious belief which co-opts strands of multiple religions chosen by the individual usually without much theological consideration. The term derives from a woman named Sheila Larson, who is quoted by Robert N. Bellah et al. in their book Habits of the Heart as following her own "little voice" in a faith she calls "Sheilaism".^[11].

In chapter 9 of their 1985 book *Habits of the Heart*, Robert N. Bellah, Richard Madsen, William M. Sullivan, Ann Swidler, and Steven M. Tipton discuss how religion in America has moved from being highly public and unified, as it was in colonial New England, to extremely private and diverse. To demonstrate the shift, they quote a young nurse, to whom they gave the name Sheila Larson:

I believe in God. I'm not a religious fanatic. I can't remember the last time I went to church. My faith has carried me a long way. It's Sheilaism. Just my own little voice ... It's just try to love yourself and be gentle with yourself. You know, I guess, take care of each other. I think He would want us to take care of each other.

Moralistic therapeutic deism - Wikipedia

Author's analysis

The authors say the system is "moralistic" because it "is about inculcating a moralistic approach to life. It teaches that central to living a good and happy life is being a good, moral person."^[5] The authors describe the system as being "about providing therapeutic benefits to its adherent" as opposed to being about things like "repentance from sin, of keeping the Sabbath, of living as a servant of a sovereign divine, of steadfastly saying one's prayers, of faithfully observing high holy days, of building character through suffering..."^[6] and further as "belief in a particular kind of God: one who exists, created the world, and defines our general moral order, but not one who is particularly personally involved in one's affairs—especially affairs in which one would prefer not to have God involved."^[7]

The remoteness of God in this kind of theism explains the choice of the term "Deism", even though "the Deism here is revised from its classical eighteenth-century version by the therapeutic qualifier, making the distant God selectively available for taking care of needs." It views God as "something like a combination Divine Butler and Cosmic Therapist: he's always on call, takes care of any problems that arise, professionally helps his people to feel better about themselves, and does not become too personally involved in the process."^[8]

The authors believe that "a significant part of Christianity in the United States is actually only tenuously Christian in any sense that is seriously connected to the actual historical Christian tradition, but has rather substantially morphed into Christianity's misbegotten step-cousin, Christian Moralistic Therapeutic Deism."^[9]

CNN online featured an article, "More Teens Becoming Fake Christians" on Kenda Creasy Dean's 2010 book *Almost Christian: What the Faith of Our Teenagers is Telling the American Church.* (Oxford University Press, 2010). She writes, "The problem does not seem to be that churches are teaching young people badly, but that we are doing an exceedingly good job of teaching youth what we really believe, namely, that Christianity is not a big deal, that God requires little, and the church is a helpful social institution filled with nice people..." She goes on to say that "if churches practice MTD in the name of Christianity, then getting teenagers to church more often is not the solution (conceivably it could make things worse). A more faithful church is the solution.... Maybe the issue is simply that the emperor has no clothes."^[10]

Jew and Gentile Called

Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that "the person who does these things will live by them." But the righteousness that comes from faith says, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?'" (that is, to bring Christ down) "or 'Who will descend into the abyss?'" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. The scripture says, "No one who believes in him will be put to shame."

For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved." But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? I was walking from my downtown apartment above one of the main street stores to the church on a Sunday at 5:45am when I noticed 6 cars in the drive-thru lane of the fast food restaurant with the golden arches waiting either to place or to pick up their order. Some 8 years later, I picked up the 2/8-14/2017 edition of City Pages: Latest Minneapolis & St. Paul News and Events to read their movie review – Nine-Tenths of the Law: The American Dream gets supersized in the timely, troubling *The Founder*. I went online to read how NPR and other sources told the story of the golden arches.

Despite Christ's Great Commission to "go and make disciples of all nations," evangelism is a task I have most often avoided.

I usually associate evangelism with an effort to convert nonbelievers to Christianity, something that makes me very uncomfortable. Too often the desire to bring about conversions grows out of a belief that nonbelievers need to be "saved" from eternal damnation by adopting the Christian faith.

To the extent that evangelism is about "saving souls," I want nothing to do with it.

I approach matters of faith and belief with humility, unwilling to assert the superiority of my own religious beliefs over those of others.

Chapter 8.

MEMBERSHIP

***C8.02.** Members shall be classified as follows:

c. *Voting* members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of the congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
