Be it resolved: Getting spiritual on the brink of a new year | The Lutheran

Sure, you may have made some New Year's resolutions already, but have you made any *spiritual* resolutions for 2012? In 1535, Martin Luther's friend, Peter Beskendorf, asked for advice about prayer. The reformer's response came in the form of an open letter titled "How One Should Pray, for Master Peter the Barber." His basic message to Beskendorf was to use the spiritual gems found in the Small Catechism as a guide for prayer and spiritual growth. It's still good advice. But there are other disciplines, routines and practices to spiritually focus us in this new year. Here are seven: 1. Read the work of an unfamiliar spiritual writer.

Classical and contemporary writers provide a feast of spiritual food. To get you started, consider one of these:

- Celebration of Discipline: The Path to Spiritual Growth by Richard J. Foster (HarperSanFrancisco, 1988).
- The Long Loneliness: The Autobiography of the Legendary Catholic Social Activist by Dorothy Day (<u>HarperOne</u>, 1996).

• What's So Amazing About Grace? by Philip Yancey (Zondervan, 2002).

• Story of a Soul: The Autobiography of St. Therese of Lisieux by St. Therese of Lisieux (<u>ICS Publications</u>, 1996). Find inspiration in their words and practices. Consider meeting weekly with several people to discuss the wisdom of an author and how his or her insights could apply to your lives.

Christmas 2 C: On New Beginnings and Audacious Promises | ... In the Meantime – David Lose

John's story about Jesus is designed from beginning to end not just to tell us, but to evoke for us, the living, breathing promise of a new beginning to all of human history in and through the incarnate Word, Jesus the Christ. That's why he patterns his opening after Genesis. That's why he records seven signs (what we often call miracles) in his Gospel and then culminates with the eighth sign of resurrection as the eighth day, the start of a new week, chapter, and epoch. That's why the resurrection happens – only in John's Gospel, note – in a garden, to remind us of the Garden of Eden so that we might see the resurrection as the new creation. What an appropriate theme for a sermon offered on January 3rd!

Happy New Year in the Lord's Service

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. (1 Peter 2:9)

The beginning of a new year provides the opportunity to look at life in a new and fresh way. With the start of another new year, this congregation looks ahead to the future.

In the Latin-speaking West, the holiday emphasized the visit of the magi. The magi represented the non-Jewish peoples of the world, so this was considered a "revelation to the gentiles."^[31] In this event, Christian writers also inferred a revelation to the <u>Children of Israel</u>. John Chrysostom identified the significance of the meeting between the magi and <u>Herod</u>'s court: "The star had been hidden from them so that, on finding themselves without their guide, they would have no alternative but to consult the Jews. In this way the birth of Jesus would be made known to all."^[32]

When I meet with the parents for an orientation prior to the baptism, I usually do the following:

Start with a prayer from the service of Holy Baptism and engage in conversation.

Show Washing in the Word: The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

Go through the service of Holy Baptism and Small Catechism of Martin Luther - The Sacrament of Holy Baptism in Augsburg Fortress | Evangelical Lutheran Worship

Go through Daniel Erlander Publications - Let the Children Come: A Baptism Manual for Parents and Sponsors Emphasize Martin Luther's statement:

Most certainly father and mother are apostles, bishops, and priests to their children, for it is they who make them acquainted with the gospel. In short, there is no greater or nobler authority on earth than that of parents over their children, for this authority is both spiritual and temporal. Whoever teaches the faith to another is truly an apostle and bishop.

(Luther's Works 45:46, "The Estate of Marriage, 1522," Walther I. Brandt, ed. Philadelphia: Fortress Press, 1962). Explain the service of Holy Baptism at the font and the receiving line following the service of worship as well as answer any questions.

Show them the Small Catechism by Martin Luther at the back of Evangelical Lutheran Worship and explain that Luther intended it as a devotional for parents to use with their children.

When congregations use a Faith Inkubators + Inkubators / Faith Stepping Stones or Milestones Ministry | A Vital Partnership Between Home and Congregation, I seek to carry out local customs.

Take the Promise Seriously

The first step in helping the congregation take this promise seriously is to unapologetically declare, to both the congregation and those preparing for baptism and their families, that this congregation takes this promise seriously. By being baptized in this faith community, candidates for baptism or their parents are inviting this expression of Christ's body into their lives. This might be a most countercultural statement, since many people regard their lives as their own and the raising of children as something left to parents' sole discretion. Praying for the newly baptized may lead the congregation to reach out to the newly baptized when they are absent from God's faithful people, particularly from hearing God's word and receiving the holy sacraments. Both the congregation and the newly baptized should know that in baptism God makes us part of one another's lives.

[The following was written for the local newspaper.]

Come and See

When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?"" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. (John 1:38-39a)

My cousin lives at the end of a suburban cul de sac. Because there is no through traffic, the kids can play in the street. Whenever I go to visit, there seems to always be kids congregated at her house, in the street, and in the yard. She, her husband, and their kids demonstrate a spirit of warm hospitality, and other kids respond to come and see, come and stay.

The church at its best is like that. Members of the faith community demonstrate a warm hospitality so that many want to come and see, come and stay. Jesus invited his first disciples, "Come and see." "They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day." Jesus speaking through the church extends the same invitation.

The congregations I serve commemorated the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (January 18-25) on Sunday, January 18 in which we celebrated the unity that is ours in the common confession of "Jesus is Lord." Congregations and denominations may differ in various beliefs and practices, but the common confession unites us.

In that spirit, I speak to you the invitation of Jesus to "come and see." If you belong to a faith community, may God work through you to extend that invitation to others. Its vision is to transform Super Bowl weekend (the weekend of the first Sunday in February) into America's largest youth-led weekend of giving and serving. Young people collect monetary and food donations during the week leading up to Super Bowl Sunday. 100% of the money and food is then given directly to local charities of the group's choice.^[1]

Started at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, South Carolina, the Souper Bowl of Caring has branched out to include schools, businesses and congregations of all faiths. Together, they have raised more than \$50 million in monetary and food donations. In 2008 alone, more than 14,000 groups collected over \$10 million.^{[2][3]}

The Souper Bowl of Caring has gained national attention, securing partnerships with nine different NFL Teams, in addition to finding National Advocates in former President and Mrs. George H.W. Bush and former President and Mrs. Jimmy Carter.^[4]

Saint Valentine's Day, also known as Valentine's Day or the Feast of Saint Valentine,^[1] is a holiday observed on February 14 each year. It is celebrated in many countries around the world, although it is not a holiday in most of them. St. Valentine's Day began as a liturgical celebration one or more early Christian saints named Valentinus. Several martyrdom stories were invented for the various Valentines that belonged to February 14, and added to later martyrologies.^[2] A popular hagiographical account of Saint Valentine of Rome states that he was imprisoned for performing weddings for soldiers who were forbidden to marry and for ministering to Christians, who were persecuted under the Roman Empire. According to legend, during his imprisonment, he healed the daughter of his jailer, Asterius. An embellishment to this story states that before his execution he wrote her a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell.^[3] Today, Saint Valentine's Day is an official feast day in the Anglican Communion,^[4] as well as in the Lutheran Church.^[5]

From a cross, a dazzling light - The Lutheran Magazine

It's after Jesus tells his disciples about his coming passion that he takes this side trip up the mountain to confer with Moses and Elijah. Only in Luke do we hear what they were talking about: "Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem" (Luke 9:30-31). This is the kernel of the gospel. All of Jesus' preaching and teaching and healing, though important and precious to our faith, are secondary to God's act of reconciliation accomplished by Christ on the cross. This is the essence of Christ: loving, selfless suffering and death for the life of the world.

Now the transfiguration makes sense. If Christ is the light of the world, the light no darkness can overcome, and if that light would blaze most clearly on the cross, it makes perfect sense that the radiant essence of Christ would break out on that mountain when Jesus was talking about his crucifixion.

Transfiguration of Jesus - Wikipedia

The transfiguration of Jesus is an event reported in the New Testament when Jesus is transfigured and becomes radiant in glory upon a mountain.^{[1][2]} The Synoptic Gospels (Matthew 17:1–8, Mark 9:2–8, Luke 9:28–36) describe it, and the Second Epistle of Peter also refers to it (2 Peter 1:16–18). It has also been hypothesized that the first chapter of the Gospel of John alludes to it (John 1:14).^[3]

In these accounts, Jesus and three of his apostles, Peter, James, John, go to a mountain (the Mount of Transfiguration) to pray. On the mountain, Jesus begins to shine with bright rays of light. Then the prophets Moses and Elijah appear next to him and he speaks with them. Jesus is then called "Son" by a voice in the sky, assumed to be God the Father, as in the Baptism of Jesus.^[1]

Many Christian traditions, including the Eastern Orthodox, Roman Catholic and Anglican churches, commemorate the event in the Feast of the Transfiguration, a major festival.

Mardi Gras food: Fastnachts doughnuts for Shrove Tuesday

It's funny how Lent, a period of penitence and fasting, gave rise to so much creative decadence in the days leading up to it, from parades to masked balls to sinfully rich foods. In medieval <u>Europe</u>, fat and sugar were forbidden in Lenten cooking, and so <u>Shrove Tuesday</u>, the day before the start of Lent, was a busy day in the kitchen. The English made pancakes, the Poles jelly doughnuts called *paczki*. In <u>Germany</u>, women bustled about frying up doughnuts called *fastnachts* (German for "Eve of the Fast").

Mardi Gras Pancakes! | ... In the Meantime – David Lose

It's got a familiar ring to it – feast before the famine. In a sense, that's a large part of what Mardi Gras – literally, "Fat Tuesday" is all about. But not entirely. Yes, one part of the celebration is the splurge before the fast (which, as any dieter knows, actually makes the faster harder!) But the larger and historical element of the day was to use up all the fat in the house that would not last through Lent to Easter. Hence, the "fat" in Fat Tuesday.

The day is also known as "Faschnaut Day" – faschnauts are potato-based donuts fried in lard (again in the attempt to use up one's lard) – and "Shrove Tuesday," which puts the emphasis on preparing to be "shriven" – confess one's sins – in preparation for Lent.

Foundations of Our Faith Lenten Services Begin Ash Wednesday

During the time of the early Christian church, the forty days of Lent was a time of preparation for the candidates to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. People new to the faith would spend this time fasting, praying, and studying in anticipation of their baptism. With that tradition in mind, we use the midweek Lenten services to focus on the basics of our belief. Each worshiper will be given a cut-out of a classical Christian symbol to eventually make a hanging mobile appropriate for the home. The symbol for Ash Wednesday will be the cross. Other symbols will include: two tablets – Ten Commandments; fish – Jesus Christ, God's Son, Savior; triangle – Trinity; shell – Baptism; chalice – Lord's Supper. Services will be offered at 12noon and 7pm. Meals will be served at 12:30pm and 5:30pm. Come to the meals for fellowship. Attend the midweek Lenten services as a part of your Lenten discipline!

On Being a Theologian of the Cross: Reflections on Luther's Heidelberg Disputation, 1518 (Theology) [Gerhard O. Forde]

While there is increasing interest in the "theology of the cross," few people have specific knowledge of what makes it different from other kinds of theology. In *On Being a Theologian of the Cross*, Gerhard O. Forde provides an introduction to this theological perspective through an analysis of Luther's Heidelberg Disputation of 1518, the classic text of the theology of the cross. The book first clarifies the difference between a theology of glory and a theology of the cross and explains how each perspective shapes the very nature of being a theologian. The main body of the book provides commentary on the Heidelberg Disputation-the only complete analysis of this document currently available. Underlying Forde's exposition is the contention that one ought not to speak of the theology of the cross and to look at all things through suffering and the cross.

The imperator may possibly have had his face painted red and wore a *corona triumphalis*, a *tunica palmata* and a toga picta. He may have been accompanied in his chariot by a slave holding a golden wreath above his head and constantly reminding the commander of his mortality by whispering into his ear.

The words that the slave is said to have used are not known, but suggestions include "Respice te, hominem te memento" ("Look behind you, remember you are only a man") and "Memento mori" ("Remember (that you are) mortal").^[22]

The Ten Commandments, also known as the Decalogue, are a set of <u>commandments</u> which the Bible describes as being given to the <u>Israelites</u> by God at <u>biblical Mount Sinai</u>. The Ten Commandments appear twice in the <u>Hebrew</u> <u>Bible</u>, first at <u>Exodus 20:1–17</u>, and then at <u>Deuteronomy 5:4–21</u>. According to Exodus, <u>God inscribed them</u> on two stone tablets, which he gave to <u>Moses</u>. Modern scholarship has found likely influences

in <u>Hittite</u> and <u>Mesopotamian</u> laws and treaties, but is divided over exactly when the Ten Commandments were written and who wrote them. According to New Testament writers, the Ten Commandments are clearly attributed to <u>Moses. John 7:19, Mark 7:10, Ephesians 6:2</u>.



Unus pro omnibus, omnes pro uno - Wikipedia

Unus pro omnibus, omnes pro uno is a <u>Latin</u> phrase that means "*One for all, all for one*" in <u>English</u>. Traditional Motto of Switzerland

Switzerland has no official motto defined in its constitution or legislative documents.^[1] The phrase, in its German (*Einer für alle, alle für einen*), French (*un pour tous, tous pour un*), Italian (*Uno per tutti, tutti per uno*) and Romansh (*In per tuts, tuts per in*) versions, came into widespread use in the 19th century. After autumn storms had caused widespread floods in the Alps in late September and early October 1868, officials launched an aid campaign under that slogan,^[2] deliberately using it to evoke a sense of duty and solidarity and national unity in the population of the young nation—Switzerland had become a federal state only 20 years earlier, and the last civil war among the cantons, the *Sonderbundskrieg*, had been in 1847. Newspaper ads that used the motto to call for donations were run in all parts of the country.^[3] The phrase was increasingly associated with the founding myths of Switzerland, which often also have solidarity as a central theme, to such a degree that *"Unus pro omnibus, omnes pro uno"* was even written in the cupola of the Federal Palace of Switzerland in 1902.^[4] It has since been considered the motto of the country. Politicians of all parties and regions acknowledge it as the motto of Switzerland.^{[5][6][7][8][9]}

Three Musketeers

One for all, and all for one (Un pour tous, tous pour un; also inverted to *All for one, and one for all*) is a motto traditionally associated with the titular heroes of the novel *The Three Musketeers* written by Alexandre Dumas père, first published in 1844. In the novel, it was the motto of a group of

French musketeers named Athos, Porthos, Aramis and d'Artagnan who stayed loyal to each other through thick and thin.^{[10][11][12]}

On November 30, 2002, in an elaborate but solemn procession, six Republican Guards carried the coffin of Dumas from its original interment site in the Cimetière de Villers-Cotterêts in Aisne to the Panthéon. The coffin was draped in a blue-velvet cloth inscribed with the motto.^[13]

The shell (usually a scallop or cockle shell) with three water drops is a symbol of baptism generally, and especially of the baptism of Christ. The three droplets remind us of the Trinity — Father, Son and Holy Spirit — into which Christians are baptized. The shell alone may also be used as a symbol for pilgrimage, and may be used as an emblem for saints known for their travels (such as St. James) or whose shrines have become destinations for pilgrims.

In <u>Christian tradition</u>, the Holy Chalice is the vessel which Jesus used at the <u>Last Supper</u> to serve the wine. The vessel is referred to in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, the word "cup" being generally used in English translations. The celebration of the <u>Eucharist</u> in Christian churches and communities retains the original elements of the *Last Supper*, the bread and the "cup" or chalice, with the celebrant using the words of Jesus, as recorded in the Gospels. There are traditions in the Catholic Church that the Holy Chalice still exists and may be identified with one of several candidates. However, the evidence supporting these claims is still widely questioned. *Inot verified in body* The Holy Chalice is also associated with the <u>Holy Grail</u>, initially a specifically literary tradition, of medieval origin.

Jesus has come not to rule Satan's kingdom, but to proclaim and to bring the reign of God. After the resurrection, Jesus will receive all authority in heaven and earth (Matthew 28:18), but it will be God's gift, not Satan's.

By defining "Son of God" not by privilege or power but by obedience to God, Jesus has already begun his journey to the cross. Though the devil has left, the temptations are not over. In Matthew 16, Peter proclaims, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God" and then completely rejects the idea that God's son should suffer and die. Jesus' response is pointed: "Get behind me, Satan!" (Matthew 16:23)

Lenten Pretzels - Catholic Education Resource Center

In the early Church, the Lenten abstinence and fasting laws were more strict than what the faithful practice today. Many areas of the Church abstained from all forms of meat and animal products, while others made exceptions for food like fish. For example, Pope St. Gregory (d. 604), writing to St. Augustine of Canterbury, issued the following rule: "We abstain from flesh, meat, and from all things that come from flesh, as milk, cheese, and eggs." Second, the general rule was for a person to have one meal a day, in the evening or at three o'clock in the afternoon, and smaller snacks to maintain strength. So, a need arose for a very simple food, which would fulfill the abstinence and fasting laws.

According to pretzel maker Snyders of Hanover, a young monk in the early 600s in Italy was preparing a special Lenten bread of water, flour, and salt. To remind his brother monks that Lent was a time of prayer, he rolled the bread dough in strips and then shaped each strip in the form of crossed arms, mimicking the then popular prayer position of folding one's arms over each other on the chest. The bread was then baked as a soft bread, just like the big soft pretzels one can find today. (To be fair, some traditions date the story to even the 300s.)

Because these breads were shaped into the form of crossed arms, they were called *bracellae*, the Latin word for "little arms." From this word, the Germans derived the word *bretzel*, which has since mutated to the familiar word *pretzel*.

Katharina von Bora, referred to as "die Lutherin" (January 29, 1499 – December 20, 1552), was the wife of <u>Martin Luther</u>, German leader of the <u>Protestant Reformation</u>. Beyond what is found in the writings of Luther and some of his contemporaries, little is known about her. Despite this, Katharina is often considered one of the most important participants of the Reformation because of her role in helping to define Protestant family life and setting the tone for <u>clergy</u> marriages.

Luther Park Bible Camp Special Emphasis on March 8

Come to worship for a taste of Bible Camp when Barb Solsaa from Luther Park Bible Camp will give the message during the service of worship. She will speak at an adult forum during the coffee fellowship and with the Sunday school children following. The children will sing camp songs for special music. She speaks passionately of this important camping ministry to people of all ages the year around.

[Some years, I called Luther Park Bible Camp to reserve their counselor teams to come to the congregation on a summer Sunday. Usually they were booked two to three years out. When Luther Park Bible Camp of Chetek, Wisconsin no longer sent out teams in the summer and instead employed a Director of Church Relations, I asked her to come to congregations to speak about the camp during the service of worship and to the adult forum and Sunday school afterwards. I picked children friendly songs for worship and asked the Sunday school to sing. I asked the organist/pianist at a congregation I was serving if she knew some such songs from the *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*. She gave the following list of songs, which were many more than I had been able to compile.]

Saint Patrick (Latin: *Patricius*; Proto-Irish: *Qatrikias;^[2] Modern Irish: *Pádraig*;^{[needs IPA][3]} Welsh: *Padrig*^[4]) was a 5thcentury Romano-British Christianmissionary and bishop in Ireland. Known as the "Apostle of Ireland", he is the primary patron saint of the island along with Saints Brigit and Columba.

The dates of Patrick's life cannot be fixed with certainty but, on a widespread interpretation, he was active as a missionary in Ireland during the second half of the fifth century.^[5] He is generally credited with being the first bishop of Armagh, Primate of Ireland.

When he was about 16, he was captured from his home in Great Britain, and taken as a slave to Ireland, where he lived for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a cleric, he returned to northern and western Ireland. In later life, he served as an ordained bishop, but little is known about the places where he worked. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland.

Saint Patrick's Day is observed on 17 March, the date of his death.^[6] It is celebrated inside and outside Ireland as a religious and cultural holiday. In the dioceses of Ireland, it is both a solemnity and a holy day of obligation; it is also a celebration of Ireland itself.



Service of Darkness

During this Tenebrae (darkness) service, seven passages from scripture representing major references to darkness are read, followed by a meditation on each. As each "word" is punctuated by a strike of a cymbal, acolytes extinguish candles, the chancel is divested of its holy articles, and the sanctuary lights lowered. The extinguished candles represent the disciples as they deserted Jesus. The totally dark church at the end of the service represents the scripture, which says that at the death of Jesus "darkness covered the earth." The church now awaits the re-lighting at Easter Sunrise.

Liturgy of Darkness

Sin Genesis 1:1-5a "The earth was without form and void, and DARKNESS was upon the face of the deep."

Confession Exodus 10:1, 21-23 "There was thick DARKNESS in all the land."

Dejection Psalm 129:7-12 "Let only DARKNESS cover me, and the light about me be night."

Judgment Amos 5:18-20-"Is not the day of the Lord DARKNESS."

Hatred 1 John 2:8-11 "He who hates his brother is in the DARKNESS."

Enemies Ephesians 6:10-12a "For we are contending... against the world rulers of this present DARKNESS."

Darkest Hour Luke 23:44-46 "There was DARKNESS over the whole land."

There is a drum roll and cymbals are loudly crashed, symbolic of the earthquake at the death of the Son of God. Sharply closed books are added to the harsh sound.

Scripture Matthew 27:57-60 The Christ candle is carried from the sanctuary. The entire church is now shrouded in total darkness.

The pastors depart in silence. Worshippers may remain for prayer and meditation and then are asked to depart in silence.
