Reflections and Resources

1) Counting the offering

In one congregation I served, the treasurer emptied the offering plates into a brown paper sack, stuffed the sack into his pocket, and took the money home to count. Congregation leadership resisted suggestions to improve the money counting practices. A few years later, I heard that a different treasurer was caught embezzling congregation funds.

Best Practices for Church Offerings

The days of carrying church offerings home in a paper bag hopefully are over, but just in case: Here are some helpful guidelines. The purpose of this procedure is to ensure that all receipts are properly recorded and protected from loss. The procedure assumes that there is both a financial secretary and a treasurer. The titles may vary, but the separation of responsibilities is an essential to fulfill the purpose of this procedure. There are many ways this model procedure can be adapted to individual church circumstances.

In another congregation I served, a teenage janitor was entrusted to pick up the offering after the Saturday evening service of worship. When suspicions arose, the local police recommended a surveillance camera, which caught the young man pocketing the cash. During the court proceedings, it came out that he was using the money to purchase illegal drugs. Counting the offering is better done following recommended procedures.



3) Insurance

I left the installed pastorate two-point parish to go into interim ministry starting 9/1/1990. The new installed pastor was scheduled to arrive from Canada the week after Easter in 1991. Lightning struck one of the churches, First Lutheran of Arland, on Easter evening, and the resulting fire destroyed the facility.

The members debated telephoning the new pastor with the news fearful that he might turn the moving van around and head back to Canada. He came and stayed, and the congregation rebuilt the facility. Fortunately, the Congregation Council had seen to it to purchase good insurance. Using a modest design and volunteer labor, the congregation came through the project debt free.

4) Acceptance and acknowledgement of memorials and other gifts

I was visiting a colleague in another state many years ago at his first call. When we went into the unfinished garage next to the parsonage, I noticed a small brass plate above the light switch indicating the donor of the electrical system for the garage. In another congregation, I walked into the pastor's study to see on my left a brass plate attached to one cabinet indicating the donor and a brass

plate on the cabinet on my right indicating another donor. Suffice it to say, I have seen my share of brass plates and other markers in church facilities down through the years.

Here's a question for the reader: "What if an individual or family wants to donate a certain item [let's say a neon cross on the steeple of an open country church] in memory of a loved one that leaders in the congregation might find objectionable?" Some may say, "You can't look a gift horse in the mouth," while others may say, "The congregation ought to be able to determine the appropriateness of gifts." One proactive way many congregations approach this matter is by drawing up a list of recommended projects or efforts for which people may designate memorials and other gifts.

7) Church safety

A set of keys is one of the first things issued to an interim pastor to gain entrance to a church facility and to lock up upon exit. Churches were left open at one time so that people could come and go. Occasionally I serve a congregation, usually in a village or open country, that continues the practice, but for most churches, not anymore. Church safety has become an increasingly important issue.

The church has always been regarded as a safe haven - a spiritual sanctuary where people can come to worship God free from worries about violence or unethical behavior by those involved in church ministry. But our culture is changing, and church leaders can no longer assume that it won't happen in my church. The chief of police invited the clergy to a joint teacher in-service and law enforcement seminar entitled "Why Teens Kill" at the high school auditorium. The speaker was PHIL CHALMERS | "AMERICA'S LEADING AUTHORITY ON JUVENILLE HOMICIDE AND JUVENILLE MASS MURDER". He helped me to get inside the mind of teen killers and to see how the larger society is promoting violence. In addition, he warned that captive audiences in schools, churches, malls, and the like are targets. An initial thought is that such shootings cannot happen in churches. Almost as soon as I thought that thought, I remembered the shooting in the Mother Emmanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, South Carolina in which nine people were killed.

ELCA leaders express grief over shooting in South Carolina- ELCA

CHICAGO (ELCA) – The Rev. Elizabeth A. Eaton, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), released a statement June 18 in response to a shooting where nine people were killed at a historic African American church in Charleston, S.C. Local authorities are calling the killing racially motivated.

"It has been a long season of disquiet in our country. From Ferguson to Baltimore, simmering racial tensions have boiled over into violence. But this ... the fatal shooting of nine African Americans in a church is a stark, raw manifestation of the sin that is racism." said Eaton.

Two of the victims – the Rev. Clementa Pinckney and the Rev. Daniel Simmons of Mother Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston – were graduates of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, an institution of Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, N.C. The Columbia, S.C.-based seminary is one of eight ELCA seminaries; Lenoir-Rhyne is one of 26 ELCA colleges and universities.

"The suspected shooter is a member of an ELCA congregation. All of a sudden and for all of us, this is an intensely personal tragedy. One of our own is alleged to have shot and killed two who adopted us as their own," said Eaton.



Evil Invades Sanctuary: The Case for Security in Faith-Based Organizations [Carl Chinn]

While some consider the need for security in religious organizations, little gets done until somebody gets hurt. *Evil in Sanctuary* confirms the need for intentional safety and security in houses of worship and other faith-based organizations. Though chapter 4 provides sound guidance on setting up a faith-based safety / security operation, *Evil Invades Sanctuary* is not a how-to church security book. It is the case for security in faith-based organizations. It tells the story of deadly force incidents in those environments in such a way to help others (especially law enforcement, civilian security operators and organizational leadership) understand what goes on inside such a scene. It also tells how less volatile issues have impacted those organizations. The lessons learned from those incidents form the base message of the book; that faith-based organizations must increase their awareness of (and preparation for) the accidental, criminal, or environmental hazards capable of compromising their primary purpose.

Active shooters, mass killers, workplace violence, domestic violence and other deadly encounters affect not only schools, theaters and malls but churches as well. All such sites are captive concentrations of typically unprepared victims. Evil in Sanctuary is a wake-up call for any mass assembly of people, especially faith-based settings. The book motivates readiness and prepares safety minded professionals to state the case clearly to their leadership, peers and community. Evil has invaded sanctuary, and will do so again.

On that fateful Sunday morning at Youth with a Mission and New Life Church, a man with a grudge set out to kill as many people as possible. In total, he succeeded in killing four people and wounding several. His rampage was only stopped by a volunteer at New Life Church who happened to be on the church's security team. Because she was armed, that security person was able to defend the church and stop a mass murderer. If she and her companions weren't there, the body count would likely have been higher in this 10,000+ member mega-church. There are many books about church security available. Those books contain great information about crimes in the church and making the church more secure. With everything from parking lot lighting to safe selection, and grounds keeping to internal cameras, those books are designed to teach churches how to do corporate security. All of them include emergency planning and all of them treat the church as any other business when it comes to security. This is NOT one of those books. Instead, Bryan looks at church safety from a different perspective - as a ministry of the church. Bryan started the Safety Team Ministry at Frontline Community Church in Grand Rapids, Michigan from scratch. With only some published materials available and a background in corporate security

and police work, Bryan created the typical church security team with typical struggles and issues. After much heartache and even more prayer, Bryan believed that church security was the wrong direction. Bryan realized that the missing ingredient was MINISTRY, and the culture of the corporate security practices and standards played a major role in the shortfall. This book is about the struggle and process of creating a church safety ministry. Instead of being rehashing corporate security concepts, this book focuses on what others don't tell you. Topics include: hiring for personality, working with the church board, working with other ministries, and having the right tools and mindset to be a ministry. The final chapter is a step-by-step guide to starting a church safety ministry in your own church. This book also includes links to valuable resources, including documentation for a church safety team, other websites for information, and other recommended books. This book is written for anyone who is interested in starting a safety ministry at their church, anyone who currently leads a safety ministry, and church staff and pastors who are interested in what church safety should be all about. This book is designed to open up a conversation about modern day church safety, and hopefully offer some insights to the process.

In an effort to prevent the physical, mental and emotional harm of children/youth and vulnerable adults resulting from sexual molestation, a sexual misconduct prevent program should be developed. Your written program should include, but not be limited to the following: (choose all or some of the elements that apply)

Policies on nursery safety (if a nursery is present at your facility)

Child and youth protection policies

Volunteer or Paid Staff Application

Employee and volunteer background screening

Two non-related adults at all child/youth sponsored activities

Written procedures for handling sexual misconduct allegations

Plans to supervise a registered sex offender, if they become known

This program should be reviewed by an attorney familiar with laws relating to this subject before the program is implemented.

- Keep your password confidential, don't share it with others and don't write it down and "hide it" at your desk. Never log someone else into your account or use another person's username and password.
- Don't store highly confidential data on your computer hard drive. If your machine is stolen, the data is stolen too.
- Don't keep any confidential data on a laptop. Laptop theft is one of the more common ways sensitive data is stolen.
- Social Security numbers should never be used as unique identifiers. Purge all Social Security numbers from data files and systems, except when absolutely necessary.
- Never set your browser to remember your username and passwords for Web sites.
- Don't store credit card numbers on your hard drive.
- Store backup CDs or disks in a locked secure spot.
- Never send confidential data via e-mail.
- Don't let printouts with confidential data sit on the office printer. Pick them up immediately.
- Make sure you properly dispose (shred) all paper documents that contain confidential data.

11) Combatting Fraud

I received a statement from the Small Business Administration dated 10/15/20 with a PRESENT PRINCIPAL BALANCE of 9400.00.

THIS IS A REMINDER THAT BEGINNING 08/02/21 A PAYMENT OF \$46.00 WILL BE DUE ON YOUR SBA DISASTER LOAN

****** THIS IS NOT A BILL *******

Your loan is in deferment status. No payment amount is currently due, however, interest is accruing on the payment you have received. You may voluntarily make a payment(s) which will reduce the amount of interest that will accrue before your payments are scheduled to begin. Use the attached coupon and return envelope to make a voluntary payment. If you have questions, please call 800 659-2955.

I called the number to state that I had not applied for such a loan nor had I received a payment. The representative replied, "Unfortunately fraud happens all too often." She suggested contacting the Office of Inspector General, so I filed a complaint with the Office of Inspector General - Small Business Administration.

The statement was originally sent to the address of a congregation previously served, which forwarded it to me. I contacted the church office, and the secretary wrote that no one had contacted them about such a loan. The treasurer wrote that he saw the statement and assumed I had applied for a loan and asked the church office to forward it to me.

I used the return envelope to send the coupon back to the Small Business Administration with a note that I had not applied for the loan nor received payment. I asked that no further statements be sent.

Funds can be used for sick leave due to COVID-19, maintaining payroll to retain employees during economic interruption, rent, mortgage payments and other limited obligations. These funds do not have to be repaid, even if the loan requested is denied, effectively making the initial \$10,000 a grant.

Defibrillation is a treatment for life-threatening <u>cardiac dysrhythmias</u>, specifically <u>ventricular fibrillation</u> (VF) and <u>non-perfusing</u> <u>ventricular tachycardia</u> (VT). [11][2] A defibrillator delivers a dose of <u>electric current</u> (often called a countershock) to the <u>heart</u>.

This <u>depolarizes</u> a large amount of the <u>heart muscle</u>, ending the dysrhythmia. Subsequently, the body's <u>natural pacemaker</u> in the <u>sinoatrial node</u> of the heart is able to re-establish <u>normal sinus rhythm</u>. [3]



Power corrupts. PowerPoint Corrupts absolutely. – Edward Tufte

In recent years, PowerPoint has become a dominant force in worshiping communities across the theological and liturgical spectrum. In churches smitten with the Microsoft wonder, its power to affect the sensibilities of worshipers and thus to shape congregational identity is almost never discussed.

A tacit assumption is that PowerPoint computer presentations are merely a means to an end, a value-neutral tool used for innocent, perhaps even noble purposes; enlarging text for the hard of seeing; reducing the demand for and thus the production of printed materials; and bringing younger people, who spend much of their lives in front of screens – TV, computer, cell phone, PDA – into worship. But PowerPoint is not value-neutral. As information design analyst Edward Tufte has argued, PowerPoint promotes a kind of cognitive style that routinely disrupts, dominates, and trivializes content.




Illustration of a typical mimeograph machine

18) Getting from here to there

What's a backup?

The purpose of a backup is to make sure that your digital data can survive any of the hazards that await. In principle, this is a straightforward process. Copy all of your files to some other device(s), keep the backup somewhere safe, and use it to restore the data in the event of a problem. If you are a one-computer user and everything you want to preserve can fit on one hard drive, it can be nearly as simple as this.

Backups have two distinct purposes. The primary purpose is to recover data after its loss, be it by data deletion or <u>corruption</u>. Data loss can be a common experience of computer users. A 2008 survey found that 66% of respondents had lost files on their home PC.[2] The secondary purpose of backups is to recover data from an earlier time, according to a user-defined <u>data retention</u> policy, typically configured within a backup application for how long copies of data are required. Though backups popularly represent a simple form of <u>disaster recovery</u>, and should be part of a <u>disaster recovery plan</u>, by themselves, backups should not alone be considered disaster recovery. One reason for this is that not all backup systems or backup applications are able to reconstitute a computer system or other complex configurations such as a <u>computer cluster</u>, <u>active</u> <u>directory</u> servers, or a <u>database server</u>, by restoring only data from a backup.

On April 2, 2017, I continued with one congregation of a two-point parish, while the other realigned with another congregation. I agreed to serve another congregation on a contract for services. As I was driving to the first congregation around dawn, two deer ran across the road, and the third deer hit my car. I made it to the church parking lot. After the service of worship, a member gave me a ride to the village where I was staying and where I parked my second car. I drove my second car to the service of worship and that afternoon made visits on 4 homebound. Fortunately, the car that was damaged was the older of the 2 cars with 191,189 miles.

21) What about flags in the church?

I served a village church and an open country church where I preached from the lectern instead of the pulpit. One reason was that the lectern at both churches was equipped with a stationary microphone, while the pulpit was not. Another reason was that there was a ppt. screen behind the pulpit at one church, while the pulpit at the other church was filled with music and flower stands, as well as a fan. Still another reason was that the American flag was within an arm's reach of the preacher standing in the pulpit at both churches. The Christian flag was positioned next to the lectern.

There are at least two issues at stake with the presence of both an American flag and a Christian flag in the church. One is philosophical.

It remains, however, for the diocesan bishop to determine regulations in this matter.

There's also the issue that, sometimes, arch Protestants have trouble accepting the importance of symbols in the architecture of worship. Sometimes they almost prefer a sterile gymnasium with folding chairs and glowing exit signs. But churches that revere tradition as a record of God's interactions with His people across time can and should esteem signs of that church's history, culture, and spiritual expedition, which for most, includes the flag of the nation to which God has assigned them. It's also my observation that the flag becomes an issue primarily to clergy, who sometimes remove it without consulting the congregation, hoping nobody will notice, as Moore mentions. On this issue, as on others, often the laity are more intuitively correct theologically than are the pastors.

God alone is holy and deserves our undivided allegiance. When we gather as Christians, we join our voices in praise and lament with our brothers and sisters in every nation, under every kind of government. Let's not confuse or forget whom we are worshiping when we come before our God.

One item a colleague brought to my attention is that a military veteran pointed out the American flag is to be displayed above church flags. So, to display the American flag and church flag at the same level goes against flag protocol for the American flag.

The American Flag may be displayed with other flags as long as its display follows the rules specified by the Flag Code. These rules were set to make sure the American Flag is in a position of prominence over other flags. The flag represents the government of the United States, and on American soil, the government is the highest authority. The American flag is even displayed above church flags, except in rare instances.

Another issue is practical. A pastor may be convinced that it is not right to have the American flag in the church but may not be convinced that the battle is worth it. On one assignment, I served 2 congregations, and one of them was in a community with a strong American Legion presence. Sure enough, the American flag stood behind the pulpit. It would have taken considerable conversation to gain consensus, and I chose not to make an issue of it during my time as an interim pastor.

For as long as anyone could remember, the American flag had been displayed in the front of the sanctuary to the congregation's left — to their right, the Christian flag. During my 21 years with the church, the flags were removed only for the decorations at Advent and to make room for vacation Bible school plays in the summer. Following VBS in July 2014, however, I did not return the flags to the sanctuary, an approach to the issue that, in hindsight, was not one of my better moments as a pastor.

I served one assignment where I was told that one of the former pastors, who was disillusioned with unbridled patriotism after serving in the military in the Vietnam War, pushed to have the America flag removed only to be pushed out of the parish to take another call in one of the Great Plains states.

22) What about guns in the church?

The Concealed Carry law raises questions for congregations as to whether to allow weapons in the church as well as whether to post signs prohibiting concealed weapons. The bishop of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin gave the following advice on this matter:

August 23, 2011

Dear Rostered Leaders.

The passage of the Concealed Carry weapons law in the State of Wisconsin has given rise to numerous questions about implications for congregations and other settings of ministry. The following is a summary of guidance from Amy Johnson, our ELCA staff person with the Lutheran Office of Public Policy in Wisconsin. Note that much is still uncertain regarding the implications of this law and how it will be applied to houses of worship and ministries, and what follows is not to be construed as legal advice. It is intended to be a resource for consideration and reflection at this point in time; as we learn more, such considerations may need to be revised.

Know that the Concealed Carry law affects more than just a person's right to carry a gun, it relates to weapons: guns, electric guns, clubs, and knives (but not switchblade knives). Although the legislation (SB 93) was signed into law, it will not take effect until November 1, 2011. Over the next several months, the Department of Justice will closely review the law and develop the emergency rules which will spell out the act in more detail. If your congregation intends to take action by posting signs, it's best to wait until more information is available. The exact language restrictions for signs are still being developed, and there are outstanding questions regarding the placement of signs in a church building. We do not know if there will be mandatory language or complicated posting requirements for our congregations.

Until we know more, the Wisconsin Department of Justice has a website dedicated to Concealed Carry and provides a list of Frequently Asked Questions. This website will be updated as the process moves forward. Keep in mind the bill was written without consideration to the unique needs of place of worship, and therefore many of the questions and answers are directed toward business and government entities. The website is:

The Concealed Carry law presents a host of questions for congregations. Our churches are places of worship and witness, and each ministry within your building (and other organizations who use it) will be impacted by the congregation's decision to post a sign. Our churches are also employers, and we would encourage your leadership to review policy and procedure manuals, and how this legislation could affect employees and the congregation's liability. The ELCA Secretary's website contains information provided by Church Mutual on liability and security measures to consider. In addition, the attached piece from Church Mutual may be helpful.

If you intend to post a sign once the law takes effect in November, the following steps might be helpful before developing a congregation policy:

Be thoughtful: Do not solely make a decision as the pastor or rush a decision by your Congregation Council but take the time to think through your response as a community of faith. If your building hosts other ministries, day care centers, or provides a meeting space for groups like AA, reach out to those partners and ask for their input on whether or not to post. Be prayerful: Use this time to discern a response the message it communicates to visitors, your community and neighborhood.

Engage the congregation: As Christians, we are called to address social issues and to create the space to have an honest dialogue with one another. See input from the congregation and work toward consensus in determining a response. If you have a social concerns committee/team, they might take the lead on this. The pastor might wish to hold forums, write newsletter articles, address the topic in sermons, etc. Again, when guiding such a conversation, remember the Concealed Carry law is not just about guns, but concealed weapons.

Treat the topic as a spiritual matter: Where does Scripture help us to understand this current situation? Where is there confusion? The members of the congregation may have strong feelings about the legislation. If the congregation intends to post a sign or respond in any way, frame the discussion in a spiritual context to keep the conversation centered on our witness as Lutheran Christians and not on partisan politics.

It might be wise to consult local law enforcement or an attorney before posting any signage.

Immunity in question

Religious institutions, like businesses and nonprofits, face one issue government entities do not: Under the law as drafted, according to legal analyses, they lose their blanket immunity from civil lawsuits if they post a sign.

But the scope of that immunity is unclear, said Stephen Knowles, an attorney for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Greater Milwaukee Synod. Questions remain, for example, about how it would interact with worker's compensation laws that offer remedies to employees injured in the course of their jobs.

"It's a fairly broad immunity provision," said Knowles, who takes no position on the question of posting. "This will have to be shaken out through case law, amendments to the statute, prosecutions."

Church Mutual Insurance Co. in Merrill, one of the larger insurers of religious institutions in Wisconsin, issued what it calls a risk alert, notifying customers about the law and urging them to consult attorneys and law enforcement officials in their decision-making, but assuring them that their insurance rates would not be affected either way.

Concealed carry law tests whether guns, God mix

At a February meeting of the Council of Religious Leaders of Metropolitan Chicago, many members were surprised to learn the law does not include places of worship among sites where concealed weapons are automatically prohibited. So said Rev. Paul Rutgers, co-executive director of the council, which includes faith leaders from African Methodist Episcopalians to Sikhs. Many also were not aware that to legally keep guns out of their institutions, they're must post signs that meet state requirements, Rutgers said.

But after council members were brought up to speed on the law, "there was overwhelming rejection of the idea that guns should be allowed in places of worship," Rutgers said. "I think the group will take whatever action is appropriate to fight against that and add houses of worship into the list" of places where guns are prohibited, he added.

Concealed weapon law impacts houses of worship

Members of congregation, visitors must be informed

If you choose to prohibit the carrying of concealed weapons at your worship center, establish a written policy and review it with your congregation. Wisconsin law also requires that you post a sign regarding this restriction. The sign must:

Be at least 5 inches by 7 inches in size.

Be posted near all building entrances and access points to your grounds in a place where anyone entering can be reasonably expected to see it.

Inform people that weapons and firearms are prohibited in your building and/or on the premises.

Regardless of your decision to or not to prohibit the carrying of firearms at your worship center, your insurance coverage with Church Mutual will not be affected. To aid in your decision, Church Mutual recommends consulting your denominational office, local attorney and local law enforcement.

23) Should decorating be done by an individual or a group?

A couple congregations I served had individuals who took it upon themselves to decorate the church facility. One involved a pastor's spouse and a son, while the other involved a school teacher. In each case, the decorators accumulated decorations – one purchased at

arts and crafts stores, while the other at thrift stores. In the former case, the long-term pastor retired, so that members of a newly formed Decoration Committee disposed of much of the decorations. In the latter case, the off-season decorations got stashed in the library so that the room became no longer usable for its original purpose. Also, the decorations did not get changed on a timely basis so that there might be three different seasonal decors in the fellowship hall, for instance, at the same time. The decorator was much beloved, but finally the Women of the ELCA and the Congregation Council both asked the decorator to pack up the decorations and move them out of the library. This process happened at a slow pace. The long-term answer was to get someone to work with her so that decorations could be changed on a timely basis and the decorations stored in an efficient manner. My personal preference tends to be *less is more*, but not everyone agrees with a minimalist perspective, and so I have learned to live with the customs of the local context. Any long-lasting changes must involve a broad consensus to be effective.

There are surprisingly few official rules about decorating churches, much to the chagrin of those who have been crowded out by Christmas poinsettias or engulfed by Easter lilies. At times, admittedly, the altar looks like it's been attacked by a rioting mob of florists.

Much of what we do is based on tradition and preference. There are, however, two church documents that offer guidance on the subject of church decor. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) provides direction on how the Mass should be celebrated. It is very specific about aspects of the liturgy that are to be the same everywhere but more general about other areas, leaving it to local bishops to provide guidelines. Church decorating is one of those latter areas.

24) Assistance to those in need

Many congregations I have served have been involved in, one way or another, providing assistance (transportation, food, clothing, rent, energy, and other assistance) to those in need. The best practices seem to be when a congregation is involved with other congregations or a community agency. One congregation, especially the pastors and staff, though well-intentioned, became overwhelmed when they tried to administer their own program and made the following recommendations:

- 1. That we discontinue distributing Care Funds directly to recipients; and that we donate the continued congregational Care Fund offerings to designated social service agencies in the community where appropriate screening, like-skills training/education, and accountability are available. Suggested agencies are CAP, Mary's House, Soup or Socks, Personal Development Center.
- 2. That we continue distributing Care Funds directly to recipients, contingent upon the successful development and staffing of a social service program with this congregation to appropriately screen recipients and provide the life-skills and education programs needed to help prevent the on-going cycle of dependence and misuse of the Care Fund.

25) Posters - hang or toss?

I have been to my share of dairy breakfasts during June Dairy Month. Most of these are held on Saturday mornings. One letter asked,

Would you please include our dairy breakfast in your announcements and bulletin for Sunday, June (<u>day, year</u>). Enclosed is a poster with all the information on it.

If the church secretary had opened this piece of mail, she probably would have put it on the community bulletin board, but because I opened this piece of mail, I placed the poster in the circular file rather than the community bulletin board. On the other hand, a poster had been placed on a community bulletin board in the other congregation I was serving at the time for a June Dairy Breakfast in an adjoining county offered on Thursday, June (day, year) at an assisted living facility. I attended this dairy breakfast. In general, when a letter comes in the mail requesting, "Pastor, please announce this event from the pulpit," I prefer to handle these requests by hanging up the posters on the community bulletin board. Occasionally, as noted above, certain community and congregation posters can be best placed in the circular file.

26) Are all these bulletin inserts necessary?

Invariably some education, youth, and music staff in large congregations want to capture people's attention and get their word out. One way is to print a bulletin insert, as they figure nobody will read a bulletin announcement listed with all the other announcements. The same often goes with community activities. Promoters of the events are not content with a bulletin announcement but instead send a bulletin insert. I do not know how many times I have tried to shoehorn as many announcements as possible into the available space in an announcement page only to find the church secretary prints off a community event insert that comes in at the last minute.

27) Keeping up appearances

During one assignment, I served two congregations. Both facilities looked somewhat similar with a kitchen and dining hall attached to a white worship facility with a tall steeple. In the open country congregation, there were only two entrances, and the main entrance opened to the dining hall straight ahead and to the right with the kitchen on the left. In glancing to the left, one could see two large garbage cans sitting next to the corner without lids. The Congregation Council decided to get a dumpster to put the garbage in, but no action was taken on getting garbage cans with lids so that people who came into the church did not have to look at open garbage cans on first glance. Later, I casually mentioned my observation to the treasurer of the Women of the ELCA while she was in the kitchen one time and suggested cans with lids. She replied, "I've never really thought about that." But soon afterwards she arranged for the purchase of two plastic garbage cans with lids. The problem afterwards was that the lids did not always get put on the cans, so the garbage was still visible. Every time I went by and noticed the garbage cans open, I put the lids back on.

At the town church, a woman in the congregation decorated the dining hall on a seasonal basis. The other decorations she left in the library so that it became so filled with boxes it was hard to get around. I heard the rumblings but waited to see how it would be addressed. The matter got brought up at a meeting of the Congregation Council, but the council did not act on it. At one meeting of the Women of the ELCA with the decorator present, the president recommended that the Women of the ELCA pay for plastic totes in which to put the seasonal decorations and that the totes be taken down into the church basement where they could be labeled and stacked. The president and others offered to help in organizing the decorations. The decorator seemed amenable to the offer.

In both situations, I resisted the temptation to become highly anxious and waited for the right timing to either allow the situation to resolve itself or to intervene.

Credit Card Usage Policy

CHURCH CREDIT CARDS may be made available to staff members with the Pastor's approval. Annual credit card fees will be charged to the ministry account of the person to whom the card is issued. These cards are to be used only for purchases for use by the Church. Statements and sales receipts must be submitted to the finance office, accompanied by a completed purchase requisition detailing items purchased and account to be charged, approved by the staff member responsible for the account being charged.

Payment will be made directly to the Credit Card Company. Statements must be submitted in a timely manner so as to avoid late charges. Late charges incurred because of late submittal will be the personal responsibility of the individual.

While a corporate credit card can make purchases more convenient for staff, consider what it will take to create and enforce a credit card policy, and to reconcile the account each month.

If your church decides that it would benefit from a credit card, the next step is to determine which staff members will receive one. You may have staff members who want access because they don't have enough financial credit to use their personal cards for large purchases. Church leadership should be responsible for deciding who receives a card, however, not the individual staff members.

31) Preschool and daycare

I served one large congregation that was contemplating constructing a new facility in order, among other things, to accommodate a growing preschool and daycare. After I left, the congregation commenced and completed such a project under the able leadership of the new installed pastor. I served another large congregation that considered a preschool and daycare but decided against it. It was a good thing because the congregation later split. Part of the membership left and formed a Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ congregation and met in rented space in a shopping plaza.

Dick Mathisen, an interim pastor in Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA, offered suggestions in an article of the 6/11/2017 Interim Ministry Association imanewsletter@msn.com The article was timely as I was preparing to accept a new assignment on 7/1/2017 where one of the congregations in a village operated an early childhood learning center.

Dick Mathisen, an interim in Southeastern Pennsylvania Synod, offered his suggestions to a gathering of SEPA interim pastors a few years ago. He discussed the entire relationship of the interim pastor and the preschool or daycare but focused especially on the financial relationship.

How much ought the preschool or daycare pay to the church as reimbursement for normal expenses? Dick had specific suggestions and an overall worksheet for calculations. Since it might be useful to other interim pastors, Dick agreed to post it on the IMA Website (imaelca.org/the-financial-relationship-of-a-church-and-its-preschool/. His brief summary of the financial relationship is based on three general principles: #1 - The Preschool or Daycare is a ministry, not a tenant. #2 -- The Preschool or Daycare ought to reimburse the church for all out-of-pocket expenses directly attributable to the Preschool or Daycare. #3 -- The Preschool or Daycare ought to make such additional contributions to the church as seem appropriate.

The trickiest question is how to calculate the expenses. Most churches simply make a guess, which is fine. However, if conflicts arise, a more detailed calculation may be useful. Even difficult items such as electricity or heat can be estimated. (The entire 4-page memo is available on the IMA Website.) 



43) Culling the files and cleaning the closets and other such matters

In some congregations, people step forward to insist that these tasks get done [as evidenced in the following open letter by the congregation treasurer to the Congregation Council]. In other congregations, I may use suggestive language [rather than the directive language of the open letter to the council] to encourage culling the files and cleaning the closets and other matters.

An open letter to the council

As some of you may know, (*financial secretary*), (*church secretary*), and I are trying to do some rearranging in the office to make it more 'user friendly' and to make room for another computer.

On Monday, we started cleaning out some files in an effort to move the file cabinets out of the corner they are in. The cabinets are rusted right to the carpet underneath! Apparently, this is common knowledge as I had been told about this issue in the past.

The storage space in the office is totally inadequate. The two cabinets are so high up that they are inaccessible without a step stool and you can't even see what's in them without the step stool. The cabinets on the floor have the opposite problem. You have to get down on your knees to see what's in them and again to get anything out that you want. The combination to the safe or the location of the combination is common knowledge to so many people in the congregation that it might as well be left open.

In trying to clean out some of the file drawers, we found dozens of pieces of paper with someone's social security number on it.

There must be close to a dozen closets or storage spaces throughout the church, but there is no rhyme or reason as to what's stored where. Old, obsolete office equipment is in the same closet as Sunday school materials. Chairs for the church are piled into the same room where the boilers and another stove for the kitchen are stored. The hallway in the 'old' pastor's office near the west entrance smells horribly and is stuffy.

There also is no rhyme or reason as to what light switch operates what set of lights.

The first thing that a visitor would notice when walking into the office is the disgusting ceiling tile that got wet last winter and hasn't been replaced.

I think we need to address this issue. Every closet should have a 'mission'. Obsolete equipment and paper should be disposed of properly. It'll be very time consuming and all of us are busy with our families. But this is the place we bring our families to worship.

Unburdening Ourselves: E-Mail Management Tips from the Experts

For most of us, though, perhaps this is overkill. A few key management practices would probably be enough to enable us to cope with our e-mail. So, what are the experts recommending? 51) Making things work

I accepted an assignment to serve as a bridge pastor for 2 congregations that had entered into a shared ministry agreement and formed a parish call committee. I saw my role as threefold: 1) carry on regular pastoral ministry, 2) work out the shared ministry agreement, 3) attend to procedural matters related to the call process. A shared ministry agreement was something the country congregation was used to, but it was new for the village congregation.

The schedule for the services of worship was 9am village and 10:30am country. I determined that I needed to leave at 9:55am to drive the 15 minutes to make it by 10:10am. On those Sundays with Holy Communion at the first service, I left after the Benediction, while on the other Sundays with the Service of the Word, I could greet some of the people. I scheduled being in the office as able at the village church on the mornings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday, and Wednesday 9-12am at the country church. I met with the church secretary and custodian at the village church on Tuesdays at 8am, while the church secretary at the country church also held her office hours on Wednesdays 8-12am. I offered confirmation instruction on Wednesday 4pm at the village church and Wednesday 5:15pm at the country church. Congregation Council as well as Parish Council meetings were scheduled on Mondays and Tuesdays.

A licensed, commissioned, or ordained minister is generally the common law employee of the church, denomination, sect, or organization that employs him or her to provide ministerial services. However, there are some exceptions, such as traveling evangelists who are independent contractors (self-employed) under the common law. If you're a minister performing ministerial services, all of your earnings, including wages, offerings, and fees you receive for performing marriages, baptisms, funerals, etc., are subject to income tax, whether you earn the amount as an employee or self-employed person. However, how you treat expenses related to those earnings differs if you earn the income as an employee or as a self-employed person.

56) When to retire

The concept of retirement is relatively recent in human experience. For most of history, people worked as long as they could and then were cared for by others.

The History of Retirement, From Early Man to A.A.R.P. - The New York Times

In the beginning, there was no retirement. There were no old people. In the Stone Age, everyone was fully employed until age 20, by which time nearly everyone was dead, usually of unnatural causes. Any early man who lived long enough to develop crow's-feet was either worshiped or eaten as a sign of respect. Even in Biblical times, when a fair number of people made it into old age, retirement still had not been invented and respect for old people remained high. In those days, it was customary to carry on until you dropped, regardless of your age group -- no shuffleboard, no Airstream trailer. When a patriarch could no longer farm, herd cattle or pitch a tent, he opted for more specialized, less labor-intensive work, like prophesying and handing down commandments. Or he moved in with his kids.

At one time, I thought I could retire at age 59 ½, but once I reached and surpassed that age (DOB 9/9/1953), I reconsidered. One of the biggest considerations is anticipated life expectancy. My father Harold L. Bolstad was severely injured in the Korean War and suffered from those wounds his entire life but still lived to age 87. My one grandfather Morten Hansen Norager lived to age 93 and might have lived longer except his one hand slipped on the chinning bar while doing chin-ups and he fell and broke his hip and never recovered. My other grandfather Kinley E. Bolstad lived to age 80. Even being deft free and owning my own home, as well as savings, IRAs, pension, and social security, I am concerned about outliving my retirement income, and so have decided at this point to put off taking the Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from Social Security until age 70 and Individual Retirement Accounts until age 72. As for Portico Benefit Services retirement benefits I plan to keep my options open.

Retirement is the withdrawal from one's position or occupation or from one's active working life. [1] A person may also semi-retire by reducing work hours.

Many people choose to retire when they are eligible for private or public <u>pension</u> benefits, although some are forced to retire when bodily conditions no longer allow the person to work any longer (by illness or accident) or as a result of legislation concerning their position. [2] In most countries, the idea of retirement is of recent origin, being introduced during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Previously, low <u>life expectancy</u> and the absence of pension arrangements meant that most workers continued to work until death. Germany was the first country to introduce retirement benefits in 1889.[3]

Nowadays, most developed countries have systems to provide pensions on retirement in <u>old age</u>, funded by employers or the state. In many poorer countries there is no support for the old beyond that provided through the family. Today, retirement with a pension is considered a right of the worker in many societies; hard ideological, social, cultural and political battles have been fought over whether this is a right. In many western countries, this is a right embodied in national constitutions.

An increasing number of individuals are choosing to put off this point of total retirement, by selecting to exist in the emerging state of <u>pre-tirement.</u>^[4]
